From Our Principal...

Welcome to Teurlings Catholic. Welcome to a **new** school year. New. Do you notice use the term “new” is always used to describe the starting of school? You can define *new* as: different from the past; fresh; modern; for the first time; unused, and having just reached a position, rank or place. I think those terms best describe our new and returning faculty members. We have a fantastic group of teachers on our campus. Some are experienced but new to Catholic education and our campus, and some have left their old professions to enter a new one as a teacher. Some have moved many miles and others a short distance. WELCOME BACK! I hope everyone had a refreshing summer and is ready to get back into the routine. To those new students and parents, I hope you will become involved some way at our school, even if it is in some small way. Please contact me at school should you have questions or concerns.

Here are a few reminders to help make everyone's school year a positive one:

- ◆ Remind your child to lock his/her locker at all times.
- ◆ Cell phones are only allowed in lockers or cars. Students are not allowed to carry them in purses, book bags, or with them—NO EXCEPTIONS!
- ◆ Please pick up your child by 3:00pm. We have no duty teachers after this time, and students are not allowed to roam the campus.
- ◆ Please do not call about parking spaces for sophomores. Announcements are made to students referring to when and where tags are available, or they can just speak with Mr. Baudier. Licensed sophomores can purchase tags with a regular license only after the seniors and juniors; then as spaces become available.
- ◆ If a student checks out, he cannot check back in without a doctor's note.
- ◆ If your child is getting harassed or bullied, please call Bruce Baudier at ext. 102 or Milton Rohm at ext. 114.
- ◆ If your child is absent, please call (ext. 0) or fax (234-8057) the front office before 8:30a.m.
- ◆ If your child will be arriving to school after 7:50, you must still call (235-5711 ext. 100) or fax (234-8057) the front office.
- ◆ All students should be appropriately dressed every day.
- ◆ Girls—follow skirt/short length rules; one earring per bottom lobe only.
- ◆ Boys—be clean shaven daily
- ◆ All students should be appropriately dressed every day.

Drop Off/ Pick Up

Please be patient in the car line. Once everyone learns the routine, traffic will flow much smoother. The most important things to remember are:

- ◆ Use the exit lane to exit only—students are not allowed to get into cars in the exit lane.
- ◆ Pull all the way up as far as you can; do not stop by the chapel to drop off your student.
- ◆ As soon as you stop, your child should quickly exit the vehicle.
- ◆ Tell your child to be waiting and looking for you in the afternoon, as to not hold up the line.
- ◆ Parents are not allowed to park and wait in the student and faculty parking lots.
- ◆ Parents are not allowed to drop off or pick up by the front office unless you are coming into the office for business.



ACT SCORES FOR CLASS OF '09

As you have probably seen in the news, the general ACT scores for the Class of '09 have been released across the country. It is hard to compare schools and systems to each other because every school (and class) has its own unique features, problems, and strengths, but we are very pleased with the performance of our students last year on the test. The 149 Teurlings seniors who took the test last year scored well above the state average and above the national average. What is even more pleasing to us is the continued growth in scores indicated by their performance.



The chart shows the state and national scores in each category, as well as our TCH scores for '09 and '08 graduates.

The state composite score was 20.1 and the national composite was 21.1. Our TCH seniors averaged a 21.9 for a composite score. Impressive enough on its own merit, the composite score earned by our seniors also reflects a growth of seven-tenths of a point which is considered statistically to be a major indicator of growth by ACT. In fact, our students, who scored well above the state average in every category, showed growth in all five areas of the test (English, Math, Reading, Science, and the Composite Score).

Our 9-10th graders will be taking the PLAN test in October here on our campus. The PLAN test is a pre-ACT that not only gives the students practice in taking that type of standardized test, but part of the report we receive gives a predicted score range for future testing on the ACT. We also use the PLAN scores to plan our curriculum revisions, as well as for placement in our honors and dual enrollment programs. For you as parents, the PLAN scores you will receive at midterm will indicate where your student may be weak on the ACT.

Finally, if you are the parent of a junior, please encourage your

student to take the ACT as early as possible in the 11th grade. The proper approach to take to that first testing is that it IS a practice run – let your student know you expect him or her to be nervous and that the first scores may not be truly reflective of how additional coursework (they are only juniors, after all, who still have a year and half of high school courses at that point to complete) will improve the score. If you have any questions about the ACT or any of our standardized tests, please feel free to contact me or our Guidance Director Anna Proctor.

FRESHMEN ADJUSTMENT

Guidance counselor Milton Rohm and I met with freshmen students to discuss:

- ✓ Homework is a must do on the Teurlings Catholic campus. In most classes, homework carries the value of a letter grade – up one grade if all the work is completed, down one grade if the homework is not done. We reminded the students they are past the point where a teacher can pull them in at recess to complete an assignment. Complete work has to be turned in on time.

- ✓ Make-up testing is at 6:30 AM Tuesday-Friday. No make-ups are given in the classroom (the student misses another day of instruction when make-ups are given in class). If a student is absent for 1-2 days, he or she should be here at 6:30 AM to take a missed test on the first day back to school. For longer absences, the student is given a day to meet with the teacher about missed material. Students are expected to get assignment while out from classmates and Renweb for absences of 1-2 days. Again, for extended illnesses, an email to a teacher is appropriate.

- ✓ High school students need to keep the lines of communication open with their teachers. If there is a problem, the student needs to speak with the teacher before class, after class, during break, before school, after school, or during lunch. Mr. Rohm and I “coach” our ninth graders on how to appropriately make that contact productive. As we like to tell the ninth graders, they are now young adults and need to make an attempt to resolve problems on their own. Of course, if the student’s attempts do not produce results, it is perfectly acceptable to have a parent contact the teacher. We do ask that the student and the parent, if necessary, speak with the teacher prior to contacting an administrator.

SCHOOL/HOME COMMUNICATION

We have gotten messages from some parents who aren't receiving our emails; particularly those sent to the entire school population. The problem might be with your Internet/email provider (centurytel.net, cox.net, and Ipss.net).

We sent a number of emails to all parents over the summer and during the first few weeks of school. If you haven't received any, please check your spam filter and/or contact your provider to make sure you can accept emails from **tchs.net**.




Way to go to Chelsea Carroll. She


MANY PARTS, ONE BODY



According to the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), each school system must notify the public of inspections, response actions, periodic surveillance and re-inspection activities on an annual basis.

This is to inform you that AHERA Compliance Management Plans are available for public inspection in either the principal's or coordinator's office of each school site in the Diocese of Lafayette School System. These documents include the Inspection Reports, Re-inspection Reports and the Management Plan. Requests to view these may be made Monday – Friday during regular school hours.

Inspections of Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) are made by each school every six (6) months. Every three (3) years, re-inspection is conducted by a Certified Asbestos Inspector/Management Planner.

CITIZENS FOR EDUCATIONAL CHOICE (CEC)

Citizens for Educational Choice (CEC) has designed an electronic advocacy tool to help parents of nonpublic school students connect with and influence their state legislatures. Parents in our schools should sign up for this tool right away. Please register on the CEC website: www.louisianacec.org.

This new tool is called Voter Voice and is very easy to use. Once you have registered on the CEC website you will receive Legislative Alerts from CEC's lobbyist, Danny Loar, during the legislative session. The alert will ask you to contact your local legislator, which you will do by clicking on an electronic link.

You will only receive four or five of these action alerts per legislative session. Legislators want to hear from you. The entire process will only take you 5 minutes, and you will be working effectively at limiting the size of your school's tuition increases (by increasing the Required Service funding) and defeating bad bills that would hurt our schools and your children.


