Bits and Pieces.....

Dropping off students in the morning:

This seems to be going smoothly. When 7-8 cars pull up, drop off, and exit and 7-8 more vehicles cycle through the line it moves smoothly. Please remember: Students are not allowed to be dropped off in the back baseball lot area nor in the front of the main office area. Also, please do not “cut” through the front student parking area to avoid the drop off line.

Picking students up in the afternoon:

I am aware that this aspect can move slowly at times. The line can only move as fast as the kids can get into the vehicles. The initial 5-10 minutes is very, very slow because the kids go to their lockers to exchange books, get lunch boxes, etc. Then, the inevitable time to catch up on the “day’s scoop” from their “BFF” occurs. Once the line begins to move, it generally is steady but slow. Since most kids have cell phones, a parent calling them and reminding them to “get moving” may help. Again, picking up in the back lot, front lot, and in front of the main office area is not permitted. Also, using name cards helps the line move quicker.

When in Doubt – Don’t:

Should a question arise as to what can/can’t be worn, don’t wear it. Simply bring the article of clothing to Mr. Baudier and a determination can then be made.

Short/Skirt Lengths:

Both are 3” measured from the top of the kneecap while standing.

I.D.’s/Lanyards:

We still have students forgetting their I.D.’s. Unfortunately, the result is the student must pay the \$1.00 fee each day to get a peel-n-stick label for the day. If a student has lost their I.D. the easiest and cheapest thing to do is to have another one made in the front office for the regular \$5.00 fee.


Here are a few reminders to help make everyone's school year positive:

- ◆ Remind your child to lock his/her locker at all times.
- ◆ Cell phones are only allowed in lockers or cars. Students are not allowed to carry them in purses, book bags, or with them—NO EXCEPTIONS!
- ◆ Please pick up your child by 3:00 PM. We have no duty teachers after this time, and students are not allowed to roam the campus.
- ◆ If a student checks out, he/she cannot check back in without a doctor's note.
- ◆ If your child is getting teased, harassed or bullied, please call Bruce Baudier at ext. 102, Milton Rohm at ext. 114, or leave a message on the private and confidential bullying hotline at ext. 255.
- ◆ If your child is absent, please call (ext. 0) or fax (234-8057) the front office before 8:30 PM.
- ◆ If your child will be arriving to school after 7:50 AM, you must still call (235-5711 ext. 0) or fax (234-8057) the front office.
- ◆ All students should be appropriately dressed every day, wearing ID and school-issued lanyard.
- ◆ Girls—follow skirt/short length rules; one earring per ear only.
- ◆ Boys—be clean shaven daily. Please remind even the youngest to shave, if needed, when whiskers are seen. Shaving is a periodic necessity.

As I reported to you last year, Teurlings Catholic, along with other schools in Louisiana and 47 other states, has begun implementation of the Common Core Curriculum. Common Core is a national set of standards in math, English language arts, science, and social studies. The idea is to ensure that students in Louisiana receive the same basic instruction as students in Oregon, Michigan or any other state. Notice that I said "same basic instruction." Yes, there are national standards and we are in the process of implementing those standards. As in the past with the old Louisiana Grade Level Expectations and Curriculum, we will ask our students to do more than required by the state.

With all the news attention focused on the Common Core as schools began across the country, I thought perhaps I should discuss some of the common misconceptions being circulated. Yes, the Common Core is a set of national standards, but every state has the right to "tweak" those standards. Again, every school also has the right to do so. I think the goal of those educational officials who began the push for a common set of standards more than 10 years ago was to level the playing field for students across the country. Good example? Look at what has happened to ACT scores in the last few years. While our scores here at Teurlings have steadily risen, scores across the country have fallen. In English, for example, Louisiana students overall score higher than students in many areas of the country.

That can partially be attributed to an influx of non-native English speakers in some areas, but it was also a result of Louisiana's state English curriculum standards, which were higher than many other states. In math, Louisiana, like most of the south, has struggled to keep up with East Coast and Midwest states. National common standards should help close those gaps.

I have heard critics say that Common Core is anti-Christian. There is NOTHING in the standards that promotes or denigrates any religion. In the social studies standards, there are provisions for the study of the major beliefs of world religions, but we have always included that in our studies here on the TCHS campus. Yes, the national science standards include the teaching of evolution, but, again, we teach that concept in our science and social studies classes, per the Catholic Church viewpoint that God created all life. Schools are free to additionally teach creationism, as we do.

The third major complaint I hear about the Common Core is that it is the beginning of an attempt by the federal government to take over management of education from the individual states. Again, we have to remember that participation in Common Core is a state option, approved by each state's department of education and legislature. Louisiana opted into the program.

So, how does Common Core affect your student at Teurlings Catholic? If you are the parent of a 10-

12th grader, your child transitioned into Common Core last year in English and social studies and you never noticed. Why? Because we were already doing most of what is in the standards (and teaching methods) for those subjects. You will also see no major change in the science curriculum as we incorporate the new "Next Generation Science Standards" adopted last May. You will see, in future years, changes in the ACT, SAT, PLAN and other national standardized testing, which is currently being revised to correlate to the new standards. Again, I am not worried about our students meeting those standards.

There are major changes being incorporated into some areas of our math program, most notably in Algebra I and the senior-level courses. One-to-one technology is being implemented in our Advanced Math, Advanced Math II, Calculus, and Honors Algebra II courses with each student using a laptop in place of a textbook. In Algebra II and Geometry, again, the new standards are being incorporated smoothly. In Algebra I, we are dealing with students from 35 different elementary programs and 35 different math programs, so incorporation of the new standards is a little slower, but progressing.

Change is always hard, for students and teachers alike, but we live in a changing world and we all adapt. Common Core will, we all hope, be a rewarding educational experience.





PLAN scores are used to assess strengths and weaknesses, determine college readiness, and to place students into Honors courses.

AHERA Asbestos Management Plan

Dear parents,

The regular session of the 2013 session of the Louisiana Legislature recently ended. Our school is a member of Citizens for Educational Choice (CEC). We need to participate in an electronic advocacy tool designed to help parents of nonpublic school students connect with and influence their state legislatures. **Parents in our schools should sign up for this tool right away in order to have your voice heard at the State Capitol in Baton Rouge. Please register at the CEC website www.louisianacec.org.**

The first time you do this the system will ask you to fill out a user profile with your name, street address, city, state, zip code, and email address. The system needs your zip code in order to determine your local legislators. The system will then electronically address the email you will be sending to them. Your name and address will appear at the bottom of the email. The Privacy Policy on the website clearly notes that none of your information will be given to any other entity, either by CEC or the software vendor.

This tool is called Voter Voice and is very easy to use. Once you have registered on the CEC website you will receive Legislative Alerts from CEC's lobbyist, Danny Loar, during the legislative session. The alert will ask you to contact your local legislator, (Senator or Representative) which you will do by clicking on an electronic link.

It is very important that the legislator reading the email know that you actually live in his or her district. They know through their campaign work that streets are in their district. The email will look like it came directly from you, thereby maximizing its impact on the legislator. CEC's name will not be shown on the email the legislator receives from you.

You will only receive three of these action alerts per legislative session. Legislators want to hear from you. **The entire email process will only take you 5 minutes, and you will be working effectively at increasing the monies your school receives from the State (by increasing the Required Services funding), as well as defeating bad bills that would hurt our schools and your children.**


