From Our Principal...

The Academic Pep Rally held on March 17 was a fantastic display of school achievement and talent. The theme was, "Hard Work Cafe." The Rebel Dome was filled to standing room only and Run DMC, John Travolta, Michael Jackson, Aretha Franklin, N Sync and the Stache Stallion showed up on stage. The TCH drum line and chorus participated for the first time and were show stoppers. Our faculty members and parent volunteers are to be commended for orchestrating such a fabulous event. What a great way to spotlight the academic success of our students! Two hundred fifty-nine students were recognized as XL award winners; that's 38.0% of the total student body. Finally, thirty-three seniors were recognized for scoring twenty-five and higher on their ACT test.

On Holy Thursday, April 1, we will hold our annual sunrise Passion Play at 6:45 a.m. This is a great way to begin the most important four days of the Catholic Church and to share it with family. This is a senior class project and once again the class will elevate themselves as the spiritual leaders on our campus. The school will notify the appropriate law enforcement agency of any planned activity associated with any school activity where alcohol may be present. Students will be breathalized by uniformed security before entry to the prom. As a school we are not gamblers; we take every precaution to safeguard our students.



Uniforms: 2010-2011 school year

The following TCHS uniform modifications for the 2010-2011 school year are minor:

Socks: When wearing long pants, students will be able to wear navy or black socks. White socks will still be required when shorts are worn.

Sweatshirts/Outerwear: Due to the fact that our students must be outside in transition between many classes and at lunch, any jacket may be used outside. When students are in the classroom, at mass, or in the library the jacket <u>MUST</u> be removed. TCH approved sweaters/jackets purchased from an approved vendor are acceptable. The only 'jacket' that a student may wear in a classroom, library, or at mass is the approved TCH letter jacket (Speech, Academic, or Athletic jacket). The only sweatshirt students may wear is the Teurlings Catholic sweatshirt which is available only through our student council. The cost is \$20.00. No other sweatshirt can be worn during the school day. On "free dress/ jean days" students may then wear any other appropriate <u>non-hooded</u> sweatshirt. Hooded sweatshirts are not allowed at any time during the school day.

Shoes: Parents are reminded that if a student is directed by a health care provider to wear specific shoes other than the school approved shoe, a written note from the medical provider is required. Also, one note regarding shoes - the Reebok classic running shoe which the majority of students wear is available in nylon and also leather. I have had parents of students wearing the leather shoes tell me that the leather, to them, wears better and fits more comfortably than the nylon.

Laptops, I-Phones:

Last month, as many of you know, Teurlings Catholic updated its Technology policy to include limitations on laptops, along with other electronic devices. The policy was developed to allow the use of personal laptops in the library and in classrooms in which teachers monitor and allow their use.

Prior to updating the policy, we found students (under the guise of 'taking notes' on their personal laptops) communicating with each other in different classes. During lunch and some classes, students were viewing inappropriate movies downloaded at home and brought to school. There were other class-to-class communication scenarios, including the use of pictures taken using laptops with 'web cam' capabilities.

Teachers will now have the option in their respective classes to allow students who have a signed laptop policy on file at school to use their personal laptops. Students may also use their laptops in the library any time, with the librarian's approval.

Personal laptops may be used by a student ONLY in a class when a teacher has given that student permission. The educational benefits of computers are well documented and the Teurlings Catholic Administration will continue to monitor and update its technology related scenarios.

Any electronic device that can connect to the internet, such as the I-Pod Touch, is prohibited and those violations are treated like cell phone and laptop violations.

I would like to thank everyone for a great Academic Pep Rally and recognize our students for their accomplishments. I also want to add my congratulations to the students who participated in the 2010 District Literary Rally on March 20 for the largest number of placements in many years. The following students qualified to compete at the Louisiana Literary Rally at LSU on April 17: First, second, and third place district winners, speech students from the Tournament of Champions, and our foreign language and art students who were pre-qualified. Congratulations to the students inducted into the TCHS chapter of the National Beta Club. On Thursday, April15, we will recognize students who achieved a 3.0 or better GPA for the third quarter; RABC will provide prize drawings. It is great to see so many students honored for their academic achievements. The parade of academic stars will continue with our Honors Convocation on Sunday, May 16 (invitations will be mailed at the end of this month). We will recognize the seniors who have earned college scholarships at the Senior Mass on April 29, and seniors will again be recognized with graduation on May 17.

Student scheduling for the 2010-2011 school year is officially underway. Student requests were due on March 31 for initial consideration. Students are scheduled according to their grade level as they need particular courses to meet graduation requirements. The 2011 seniors

are scheduled first, followed by juniors, sophomores and finally freshmen. If your freshman or sophomore requested a popular elective, please understand upperclassmen get first preference. Because so many variables go into senior scheduling, I will meet with our twelfth graders on an individual basis to complete their schedules. I have tentatively set the week of April 19-23 to meet with seniors, the week of April 26-30 for junior scheduling, May 10-14 for sophomore scheduling, and May 17-21 for incoming freshmen. As I finish each grade level, students will receive a printout of their tentative schedule for 2010-2011. If there are changes made during the summer, a copy of the updated schedule will be mailed or emailed to the student. All students receive a final copy of their schedule during Orientation at the beginning of the new school year. Every year the Diocese of Lafayette recognizes outstanding teachers and Catholic school supporters from throughout the diocese. Teurlings is proud of our 2009-2010 representatives: Teurlings Catholic Educator of the Year, Mrs. Norma Schexnailder, and Catholic School Achiever/Supporter of the Year, Mrs. Colette Anzalone.

Mrs. Norma Schexnailder Outstanding Educator of the Year



"No matter what kind of day you are having, even if it is a very stressful one, you will always feel peaceful once you enter Mrs. Schexnailder's room," says Michelle Simon, a sophomore student at TCH. "And it always smells so great!" added sophomore Logan Verrett.

Other student adjectives used to describe our **2009-2010** Educator of the Year, Mrs. Norma L. Schexnailder included serene, calm, a positive aura, not pushy or harsh. "Mrs. Schexnailder isn't mean but she will say it exactly how it is," continued Michelle. "She doesn't beat around the bush when she tells you what to do," injected Logan. "…then she shows us HOW to do it!"

Mrs. Schexnailder has been teaching high school English for the past thirteen years, eight of which have been here at Teurlings Catholic High. She instituted a class for "Interpersonal Communications" into the curriculum at St. Martinville Sr. High. Here at Teurlings, she helps her students tackle projects on Mythology, Night/ Holocaust, The Merchant of Venice, A Christmas Carol, and Lord of the Flies.

To further her students' education and peak their curiosity, Mrs. Schexnailder will often invite guest speakers and resource people who are professional writers and poets. When studying "Of Mice and Men," Mrs. Schexnailder invited the mother of a special needs child. Students asked questions about the necessities and lifestyle of someone who requires extra care and attention. They were able to understand the concept of the book more fully with this personal hands-on approach.

Mrs. Schexnailder graduated from UL Lafayette with an English major and a Library Science minor. She and her husband Maurice are the parents of three Teurlings Catholic High School

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graduates: Jenni (1980 – 2002), Holli (age 26), and David (age 24). "*Catholic School Educational Excellence* means that each student should receive a vigorous and exemplary education, focusing on the basic core subjects as well as being surrounded daily by the Catholic faith, both spiritually and visibly." 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REBELATION GRADUATION 2010

Seniors and Parents

Graduation will be here before we know it! So that you may begin preparations for the "Big Events," please note the requirements to be met by each student in order to graduate and the dates and times for senior and graduation events.

Graduation Requirements

- All debts to Teurlings Catholic High School, including tuition and fees-for lost textbooks, library fines, and balances with the cafeteria, must be cleared before a senior will be allowed to take his/her exams, which begin on May 3, 2010.
- In order to receive a Teurlings Catholic High School diploma, a student must pass a total of 26 units including all state-required courses. A student who fails to qualify under this standard may participate in graduation exercises if, and only if, he/she passed a total of 23 units, including all state-required courses and Theology IV. Such students will not receive a TCH diploma, but a diocesan diploma.
- Any senior student who receives a grade of "Incomplete" in Theology IV or fails Theology IV for the year shall not be granted a TCH diploma and shall not participate in graduation ceremonies.
- Please refer to the TCH Student-Parent Handbook for clarification of the aforementioned requirements and policies.
- Any student who is determined by the sponsors, faculty, or administration to be under the influence of alcohol or any otherwise inappropriate substance during any school-sponsored event will not be allowed to graduate on stage or to participate in any other graduation event. Such students will also be subject to disciplinary action.

Dates and Times of Events

- The Senior Liturgy will be celebrated on Thursday, April 29, 2010 at 8:36 a.m. in the school gymnasium. Family and friends are invited to join the seniors for this celebration. Seniors are to wear Sunday dress attire.
- Senior Exams are scheduled for May 3 May 6, 2010. The schedule for exams will be announced for a later date.
- Senior Awards will be held at the Honor's Ceremony, Sunday, May 16, 2010 in the TCH gymnasium. Attendance at this function is by invitation. Dress Code: White Stoles will be distributed in the gym lobby prior to the ceremony to all seniors receiving awards. (No Graduation Cap). Girls Graduation gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). Boys Graduation gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie.
- Graduation and Baccalaureate Mass Practice will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 17, 2010, at the Heymann Performing Arts Center. Attendance is mandatory for all graduates. Students should be aware that practice will last until rehearsals meet expectations for the final ceremony and, therefore, should not plan any other activities before 12:00 noon. White Stoles, Report cards, and picture forms will be distributed at this time.
- ◆ Baccalaureate Mass will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, May 17, 2010, at the Frem Boustany Convention Center, which is adjacent to the Heymann Center. Graduating seniors are to report at 4:45 p.m. on that day. Attendance at this Mass is mandatory for all graduates. In order to graduate on stage, the student must attend the Baccalaureate Mass. Dress Code: Girls Graduation cap and gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). Boys –Graduation cap and gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie.
- ◆ The 2010 Graduation Ceremony will be held at the Heymann Performing Arts Center immediately following the Baccalaureate Mass. Dress Code: Same as Baccalaureate Mass. Girls will be given a class flower to hold and boys will wear a boutonniere. Beta Club, National Honor Society and Honor Graduates will receive additional accessories during the Convocation. These accessories should be worn Graduation night. No other decorations or flowers are allowed at the ceremony.


